Message from your City Manager ...

A lot going on this spring in your city, such as:

- Plans are being developed for staff to begin accepting proposals from engineering firms for development of a long range, sewage expansion plan.
- A new well construction project is underway and it looks to be the best well the city has.
- We should be live streaming council meetings in May and as part of that project, we are improving the audio-visual capabilities within the Council Chambers.
- New sidewalks have been identified to start this spring, Allen Street to City Hall and Shoal Creek to Rain Hill subdivision.
- Main Street Park, Phase I construction went out for bid in mid-April with bids due back 30-days later in hopes of construction starting soon after. Funded by SPLOST.
- With completion of a recent land acquisition, the city now owns two lots along Allen Street that will be developed for a Farmer's Market. Planning for this facility is underway. Funded by SPLOST.
- We are being forced to install locks on our fire hydrants. DCEMS will of course have access but water theft has caused the need to do this. What's more, when water is taken unbeknownst to City staff it creates cloudy water in homes, schools and businesses and mandates usually an after-hours call to employees. If you see anyone accessing a fire hydrant that isn't a fire/EMS unit, please notify City Hall at 706-265-3256.
- Fire hydrant testing to ensure ISO ratings are maintained will be coming soon. We will try to alert folks when this is about to happen.
- Food truck night, May 4th, come join the fun.

Finally, I had wanted a lending library and food bank at City Hall. I delegated it to Public Works Manager, Trampas Hansard, who came up with the idea to use whiskey barrels to fit in with the theme. He in turn, contacted Loyte Bennett, who designed and fabricated one of each. These are placed in front of City Hall adjacent to the GRHOF. Please feel free to borrow a book or share some food. Donations for both are accepted at City Hall.
