

TSPLOST was passed by the voters on May 21st. Transportation projects will get started community wide in coming months, after funds are collected.

June 7th had one of our best crowds yet at our second Food Truck Friday of the year, with Bebo's Grill (BBQ), Chuy's Tacos, Brookton Catfish School, Old Dad's Wings, Pattykakes, IGY6 Coffee, Best Ice Cream on Wheels, live music, two inflatables – an obstacle course for children and a toddler's bouncy house. Our next event is July 12th. The Farmer's Market is open every Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Come out and get some fresh produce, flowers, meats, and handcrafted items.
