Public Works









This summer the City of Dawsonville applied and was accepted to employ two bright and talented students through the Georgia Tech Center for Innovation PIN Internship program to work on bringing life to 2 strategic plan projects: Joanna Zwemke from UNG, and Andrew Purcell from Berry College. Joanna worked to design s streetscape mural project concept that would both beautify and increase safety for the historic square, as well as link to our local history online story-map. Andrew worked to design art installations intended to interpret local history through public art for our future living history trail, including an interactive display recognizing Dawsonville's national impact and a "Hall of local Heroes" recognizing individuals who made a local impact. 
